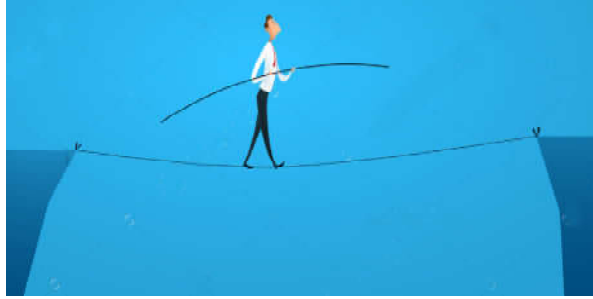


The Health(care) of Small Business
